1st Con - Objects to items 7. Homecoming, and 8. Bear Fair, having more point value than the rest of the items.

2nd. Pro - Homecoming and Bear Fair are the largest club activities of the school year, so therefore they should receive more point value than the rest of the items.

2nd Con - Too large a spread of points on 7 & 8; whereas the spread is smaller on the rest of the items.

Norman then called for the vote after receiving 2 pros and 2 cons. The vote was: Yes: 22; No: 4; Abstain: 1.

The Best Club Trophy Code was then referred to CSA for final approval.
