A. **(Fernando Vallejo)** Dining Common during events and while it is rain

- It was unfortunate to see that during the Peers Event the Dining Commons were closed during the majority of the day during a rainy day, even a larger discussion needs to take place for when this matter occurs in the future
- Zack: The decision to close the Dining Commons was not made by Peers but rather by Facilities, it would be a good idea to talk to facilities about that

- Robert: We can influence that easily, we have a challenge with Facilities schedules so if students and myself can sit down and talk to Facilities that would be powerful

C. **María Salcido)** Public Transportation: I will be collecting Data regarding transportation if you are interested in being a part of this contact Maria Salcido

- There would be a potential \$10 fee when you register for classes that would potentially cover not only county but City Buses, in other words the \$250,000 would go into city and county buses. Be cautious on how you would present this information to other people, in order to get that 250,000 the \$10 fee would have to be voted on and passed in the next student elections
- Robert E.: We got 30,000 from the district to continue the program in 2017 at least through June
