- **(Doug Roberts)** Book Store Update I am here to hopefully dispel a couple of them (rumor) and give a little history about the bookstore. The employees of the bookstore are district employees. Over the last few years there has been a significant loss of book sales in the bookstore, but there hasn't been a significant loss of students. It has gotten to the point that over the past years the bookstore has been losing money. The bookstore operation will need to begin to be subsidized, basically this means that while we try to continue to have the bookstore it could mean taking funding away from other programs. The district is at a point that we are thinking about this process (bringing in someone else). Our bookstore is a retailer (we are the middleman). You always hear about folks that say: 'in order to save money cut out the middle man'. In this process we want to make sure that we are addressing the concerns of the students and the faculty

- Lamont: Has there been a survey of students who do purchase books in amazon and or the bookstore?
- Doug: Concerns about the bookstore have always been present, are we bucking a trend? There are currently only 6 community colleges that are still in the independent book system
- Lamont: Do you personally think that the Independent Book System is antiquated?
- Doug: I prefer that bookstores would be local, I prefer local control, but at the heart of this issue at the rate that things are going keeping the bookstore is going to begin conflicting with the operating the bookstore, as much as I regret that we may have to go the route that more than half of the districts in the state have already, at some point you kind of have to look at the facts in front of you.
- Eduardo: Do those bookstores that are also independent have these kinds of problems, and if so what are they doing to compete?
- Doug: Generally they do, and what the bookstores do to compete is add food to the sales
- Sara; Would there be potential to have a purchasing co-op with the independent bookstore
- Doug: That has been brought up, but unfortunately with most of the community college in our area we are not getting that geographical groupage of like minded courses and course curriculums, we have
- Maria: What are the negative outcomes of adopting let's say Amazon
- Doug: Amazon won't run a bookstore, in order to buy books on Amazon, for financial AID the funding for books is done through a voucher system, now that might be changing down the road but that would require different financing in order to adapt to any changes
- Robert: Auxiliary Enterprises has 4 seats available
- Sara E.: Would there be a deadline of moving out if an independent system and when would you be looking at having a new system?
- Doug: When we see that there is no profit being done, and the process of getting a new system does not happen overnight the earliest would be after the spring rush or April at the quickest
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- **(Maggie Fishman) Introduction**
- Maggie: You guys are really impressive all the questions. Ask Doug if we do move into a new system, what happens to the SWAG, and do we get to rent out the property? Worked in the State Legislator, taught in Montgomery High for 22 years, ran my own firm for students in Sacramento, I am used to asking people for endorsements. If you do the supervisor that is the tip of the Iceberg, make sure you know what is in it for you because usually they want something from you. Just as advice make sure it is the best for the students and what is best for the college. Make sure you know what you want. Does anyone have any questions for me?
- Jordan: Just as a comment Maggie is the only Board member that came through
- Maggie: We love to hear from Jordan and Sabrina, I work for you remember that, remember that about your elected officials , just as you work for the students here.
