EXECUTIVE CABINET MEETING May 25, 1968

The preliminary meeting of the Executive Cabinet for Fall, 1968, was called to order by President-elect Ralph Leef at 10:13 a.m. Ralph made an opening statement, then asked all members for their fall class schedules.

Leadership Orientation Conference -- Mr. Canevari opened the subject of the summer conference, reviewing its purpose and actual progress. Originally a program to acquaint high school leaders with J. C. student government, it has actually brought few members to C.S.A. Because of this, the suggestion was made by Mr. Canevari that only J. C. students entering or interested in student government be asked to such a conference. The ensuing discussion brought the following suggestions: to have a sign-up sheet for interested high school students as well as J.C. students, to have orientation only for J.C. students actually entering student government, to ask for a certain number of recommended high school students as well. A compromise was decided upon: to have only J.C. students -- club presidents and I.C.C. representatives, commissioners, C.S.A. members and interested people--attend a summer conference with a later, briefer conference for freshmen. This is to be entered in the Bear Facts until the end of school.

Commissioners--Ralph asked the cabinet to give him a list of prospects for appointments to open offices. Officers already appointed are: Dance Conrissioner, Linda Mardin; Election Commissioner, Cathy Chandler; and Parliamentarian, Rich Saarinen.

Schedule of Meetings--The days for weekly meetings were then discussed and decided upon, with: C.S.A. on Mondays at 3 p.m., Executive Cabinet on Thursdays at noon, Club meetings on Hondays at noon, and I.C.C. on Tuesdays at noon. Honday, Wednesday, and Friday noons are also College hours.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:20 by Ralph Leef.

- V. Reports

Student Activities Advisor--Mr. Canevari reported that the Welcome Assembly is proceeding as lanned, with posters being up by the first day of school. Ralph Leef is to be the Master of Ceremonies, with Dr. Newman and Dean Dugan as speakers and the Evergreen Tangerine as entertainment.

1500 personal telephone directiries have been given to the Junior College by Bell Telephone Company and can be used and handed out. 15 cases of small "student handbooks" have also been sent to the Associated Students; these contain various advertisements and articles concerning college and students. "Gift packs" will also be received.

The Doyle Student Center is open for students and their interests, such as cards, reading, etc. Food and drink will be allowed.

It has been requested that the student positions on faculty-student committees be filled as soon as possible with responsible students. VI. Old Business

A. Appointments--Rich Brantingham reported that Phil Braverman has asked to be appointed to the Parking Committee. Rich moved that the Executive Cabinet go on record recommending the placement of Phil Braverman on the Parking Committee. This was seconded by Steve Sheppard and passed.

Steve Sheppard moved to have the Executive Cabinet recomment to CSA the name of Jhm Reed as the non-CSA member on the Board of Reviews. This was seconded by Rich Brantingham and passed.

Alan Handelin moved to have the Executive Cabinet go on record as recommending Fat Young as the Sophomore Representative to the Executive Cabinet. This was seconded by Karen Sabelman and passed.

B. CSA Blazers--Mr. Canevari again explained the proceedure by which those eligible for blazers--all elected officers, the Finance Commissioner, and the Parliamentarian--could receive them. Rich Brantingham then mowed to move into informal discussion concerning Blazers and Sweatshirts. After a second from Conny Jones, this was passed. - WHEREAS Ralph Leef, in publishing memos to the students and faculty, has been voicing his individuals opinions; furthermore, these opinions are not held by the College Student Assembly.
- AND WHEREAS Ralph Leef, in statements to the news media, has voiced the same individual opinion.
- 3. AND WHEREAS Ralph Leef, in making public, unsupported, and false attacks upon Dr. Newman, Dean Dougan, and Mr. Harrigan, has acted irresponsibly and overlooked any advice from the College Student Assembly.
- 4. AND WHEREAS Ralph Leef, in making public, unsupported intimation that the faculty would lower his grades because of his political beliefs, acted irresponsibly and was not speaking for either the presidential office or the College Student Assembly.
- 5. AND WHEREAS Ralph Leef, despite his numerous memos and statements to the press, has not once given a report to the College Student Assembly; as a result, he has, whether knowingly or unknowingly, caused the legislative and advisory powers of the College Student Assembly to be questioned when, in fact, they have never been in doubt. This usurpation of authority from the College Student Assembly cannot and will not be tolerated.
- 6. AND WHEREAS Ralph Leef has, without Constitutional authority, judged himslef as sole interpreter of the Constitution -- an action which directly by-passed the jurisdiction held by the College Student Assembly.
- 7. AND WHEREAS the College Student Assembly shall remain the major legislative body in student government and that the opinions of this body will be heard over and above the viewpoints of a single member.
- THEREFORE, be it resolved that the College Student Assembly censure Ralph Leef, in order to show that this body is not in agreement with his statements.

RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANTA ROSA ADOPTING A POLICY STATEMENT TO SERVE AS A GUIDELINE FOR THE APPLICATION OF DESIGN REVIEW ON THOSE PROPERTIES ABUTTING MENDOCINO AVENUE BETWEEN COLLEGE AVENUE AND U.S. HIGHWAY 101

WHEREAS, Chapter 3., Article I., of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Santa Rosa requires the Board of Zoning Adjustment to grant design review approval for all industrial, commercial and multiple-family residential structures erected within the City of Santa Rosa, and

WHEREAS, the purposes of Chapter 3., Article I., - Design Review are to insure that the general appearance of buildings and structures and the development of land shall in no case be such as would impair the orderly and harmonious development of the neighborhood or impair investment in, or occupation of, the neighborhood, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission, following substantial study and review, made by itself and in its behalf, has determined it in the public interest to establish realistic, attainable policy guidelines for the application of design review for those properties abutting Mendocino Avenue between College Avenue and U.S. Highway 101.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Planning Commission of the City of Santa Rosa does hereby adopt the following policy statement to be used in the evaluation of Design Review applications filed on the above described portion of Mendocino Avenue.

- Site Plan The site plan review will consider in addition to the relationship of the proposed structure to the principal site, the relationship between the site and adjacent sites as they relate to the structure proposed on the principal site and to access and egress to and from the principal site.
- Building Design The review of individual building designs shall discourage the development of inharmonious or out of scale developments and shall encourage building design compatible with the architectural variety presently existing on Mendocino Avenue.
- 3. <u>Setbacks</u> The requirement of a building setback from Mendocino Avenue shall be determined upon evaluation of the scale of the proposed structure in relationship to the existing building setbacks established on adjacent parcels. A substantial setback may be required in special instances which are justified

by existing or proposed setbacks on adjacent parcels of substantial distances.

- 4. Landscaping In addition to perimeter landscaping, there shall be a minimum of 3% of all interior parking areas devoted to landscape improvement. In all instances, water shall be made available to proposed landscaped areas.
- 5. Off-Street Parking Required off-street parking shall be provided at the rear or side of the main structure whenever practical. In no case shall parking be allowed in the front yard setback area.

- 6. <u>Signing</u> Detached signs shall only be allowed in those special instances whereby signing on the main building is not practical or feasible. All detached signs shall be granted design review approval by the Board of Zoning Adjustment. The design, scale, color, and size of all attached and detached signs shall be complementary to the primary structure on the site. In all instances, attached signs shall be flush with the principal building.
- 7. <u>Roof Appurtenants</u> In no instance shall roof appurtenants be visable from the street. All screening or enclosing of roof appurtenants shall be subject to design review approval by the Board of Zoning Adjustment.
- Outdoor Storage All outdoor storage shall be enclosed in a structure to be approved by the Board of Zoning Adjustment. In all instances, storage materials, waste disposal bins or crated merchandise shall be screened from public view.
- Fencing Detailed fencing plans shall be provided with all design review applications and specifically approved by the Board of Zoning Adjustment.

VI. Reports

- President--Ralph Leef congratulated Karen Sabelman for being named Woman of the Month, and mentioned Dean Dougan's illness: a card will be on his desk to sign and be sent to Mr. Dougan.
- Executive Vice Presiendt--Alan Handelin announced that there will be a meeting of the Doyle Stuendt Center Committee directly after the meeting.
- Vice President--Rich Brantingham reported on the Area 7 Conference, saying that SRJC has much that other colleges are still fighting to gain the rights to, but that more compunication is needed.

Mike Fama reported that the conference also seemed to him to leave much to be desired, and asked why other delegations seemed so much more propared. Mr. Canevari replied that some colleges were oriented towards passing certain resolutions, and a discussion of the conference ensued.

- Dance Commissioner--Linda Marden announced that there will be a Coop dance Friday night featuring the Wonderful Mud and the Light Brigade.
- Elections Commissioner---Kathy Chandler reported that Nixon won the JC poll. She also asked why all JC's did not use either Robert's or Sturges' Rules of Order.
- Hyde Park-Open Forum Commissioner--Robert Gordon reported that on Wednesday, Open Forum will present representatives of 4 parties discussing the election. He also stated that the Area 7 Conference showed a duplication of effort, lack of communication, and too much self-centeredness which nullified whatever efforts that were made.
- Rallies Commissioner-Lindy Alvitre announced that there will be a Competition Rally on Friday with a \$5 entry fee, which will be returned to each club which participates. The prize is \$20.
- Activities Advišor--Mr. Canevari reported that a good, lively postmortem of the Area 7 Conference was held on the bus returning. He asked for questions, and comments and suggestions were made. Discussion then took place in the Yell Leaders' Budget; they were allotted \$310 but spent more, charging the Associated Students \$386.25. Mr. Canevari mentioned two possible courses: for CSA to grant the extra \$76.25 out of surplus and pay it, or to have the 5 yell leaders split the extra costs and repay the Associated Students. Tim Pownall moved to postpone this discussion definitely until the next meeting, when the Head Yell Leader would be present. This was seconded by Steve Sheppard and passed.

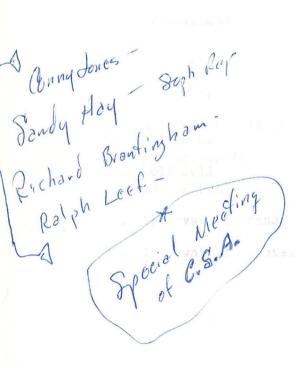

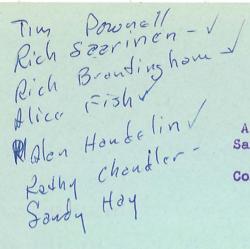

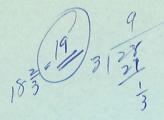

Executive Vice President -- Alan Handelin asked that the possible constitutional amendments be carefully considered and discussed.

- Vice Bresident--Rich Brantingham stated that the delegates to the State CJCSCA meet on Tuesday.
- Recording Secretary--Karen Sabelman moved that, because of Article IV, Section 4, Item B of the Constitution, John Clark be found guilty of non-attendance. This was seconded by Rich Brantingham and passed 19-1.
- Finance Commissioner--Steve Sheppard urged CSA to give a vote in CSA to the Assistant Finance Commissioner; he also announced his candidacy for Executive Vice President.
- Assistant Finance Commissioner-Bob Marmor announced his support of Steve Sheppard for the office of Executive Vice President.

The First General Assembly was held Thursday evening. The purpose was to approve the ground rules, financial report, minutes from the last conference and the followup report. But none of this work was accomplished, and the assembly ended up to be one big argument over the dress code. Briefly the dress code specified what type of clothes we were to wear while at the hotel attending the conference. It was mandatory, and it specified that if someone did not follow the code, they would be asked to change. Some colleges felt that the code should not be mandatory, or that we should not even have it. Motions were made to abolish the code, but complications arose as to the time the maker of the motion moved it and whether or not it conflicted with a written or gentlemans agreement with the management. With nothing accomplished, this first assembly concluded in one big unsettled dispute.

After this we went to our workshop meeting. I attended the co-cirricular workshop which was chaired by James Shaver from Fresno City College. The meeting was just concerned with exchanging ideas, our keynote speaker was the head of the Athletics Department at San Francisco State College. He stressed a few of the responsibilities which fell upon student government - one was to represent all the students, not just those who voted for you. He also stated that school newspapers should not be run soldy by the journalism classes nor by student government. Then delegates asked him questions concerning his views on the San Francisco State Crisis. After that we presented our specific campus problems such as: leck of participation in student elections, activities of the Black Students Union, Interracial Communications Club,(a club devoted to working on problems of all reces), the College Readiness Program, which was first started at San Mateo College, and the problem of non-students causing trouble on the campus. In short, the first workshop meeting was run informally in a seminar type manner.

The Second Workshop meeting broke up into two sections, large and small colleges (SRJC is in the small college category) and we continued our general discussion in the

same manner as the first meeting. Here, many more ideas were brought up, a few were: 1) an activities committee which plans separate activities that would appeal to either the younger or older students on campus, 2) a 10% discount for student body card holders in the bookstore, 3) a question brought up was whether or not a radical speaker should be allowed to speak if he condemns the U.S. government system.

In the afternoon, the larger and smaller colleges combined in our workshop where we passed the ground rules, went over resolutions and recomendations passed at the area conferences and brought up from the floor. The motions dealt mainly with: 1) aspects of the Students Bill of Rights, 2) favoring the efforts of colleges in setting up teacher evaluation polls on their campus, 3) favoring the investigation of a student volunteer program in community service, 4) establishment of forums consisting of students f_aculty, and administrators, in the attempt to find out the opinions of each section, 5) favoring requiring campus clubs and organizations to have and maintain active membership to remain on campus subject to the discretion of the I.C.C.

The resolutions and recomendations passed, were sent to the screening committee and forwarded to the general assembly. At the Second General Assembly we almost ran into the same type of problem as the first. This time the disagreement was over a few resolutions that did not pass the resolutions committee. Accusations were made that the committee tried to leave out the controversial resolutions. This resulted in an hour and a half recess for the problem to be figured out by two representatives from each area plus the screening committee. When we reconvened at midnight, we began going through the motions in an order of precedence, with the most important ones first. We went through all the resolutions and recomendations and passed them by general consent when possible. This assembly adjourned at 5:30 am.

At the Third General Assembly we went through those motions that were not passed

by general consent. The subjects of the motions passed at the second and third general assemblies are included in a list prepared by Rich Brantingham which is included with this report.

- I. Call to Order The meeting was called to order by Finance Commissioner Steve Sheppard at 3:20 p.m.
- II. Flag Salute The salute to the flag was led by Rich Saarinen.
- III. Roll Call Absent Were: Walph Leef and Tom Decker.
- IV. Approval of Agenda The agenda was approved as written.
 - V. Approval of Minutes The minutes were approved as written.

VI. Reports The meeting was turned over to Rich Brantingham at this time.

- Finance Commissioner--Steve Sheppard stated that he is running for Executive Vice President, then asked if there would be reports concerning the credit-non credit situation and the State CJCSGA Conference, He then explained the November budget and went on record asking why CSA does not send representatives to Rotary luncheons.
- Assistant Finance Complexioner--Bob Marmor reported on the creditnon credit system; it is a part of state law what JC students can get only twelve credit-non credit units in the entire length of J6 attendence.

Therefore Steve Sheppard rived "that Section 16 of the election code be temporarily sistemded for this election obly and that the Election Commissioner be empowered to arrange the Campaign Assembly at his discretion." 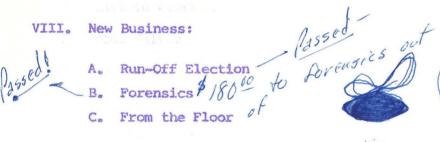

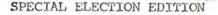

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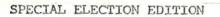

Leef Loses Election At SRJC

Santa Rosa Junior College student body president Rálph Leef went down to a resounding defeat to Dennis Vander Werff in yesterday's run-off election.

Out of the total 736 votes cast in the balloting, the 24-year-old Vander Werff tallied 474 to Young Leef's 262.

Mr. Vander Werff is a graduate of Santa Rosa High School and served four years in the U.S. Navy. Mr. Leef is a sophomore from Rohnert Park.

In the race for executive vice president, Steven Sheppard moved even higher to bring 499 votes to his camp, as opposed to his challenger Donald Lindberg who got 202 votes.

It took 410 votes to push Timothy Pownall over the top in the run-off for vice president of the junior college student body, defeating Richard Harkness' 289 votes.

Young Leef opposed recognition of the Black Student Union on the junior college campus in September, then defeated a recall movement aimed at taking him out of office.

At that vote in early October, he tallied 578 votes to 352.

Clark Hired

Another recent recommendation passed by Dr. Newman was to hire a Black student, John Clark, who was recently ousted from his voting-membership position in the College Student Assembly (CSA) for non-attendance.

Clark, 24, who carried on the battle over the Black Student Union Constitution this semester, will be employed by the district as a recruiter and counselor to disadvantaged students.

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Six New Classes At SRJC

Six new classes have been i added to the curriculum at Santa Rosa Junior College for the Spring semester, it has been announced by the Instructional oftice at the school.

The six include History 30, a course in Afro - American history. Previously this c l a s s has been offered in the evening college program, but now has been added to the day schedule as well. Taught by David Burks, History 30 places emphasis on the historical approach to the Negro in America, from African background to the present time.

Two new English programs have also been added to the class schedule. These are English 103, an Introduction to Poetry, to be taught by Donald Emblen, and English 162, a reading, writing and listening workshop for students with language problems derived from their ethnic backgrounds.

Other new offerings will include a Philosophy course in comparative religions, a special mathematics course, designed for Industrial Education majors, and an advertising workshop course.

In addition, for the first time **a** special Orientation class will be offered for Mexican American students. It will be taught by Duane Blackwell, a member of the counseling staff at the college.
